
Rapid changes to dispensing legislation








What the PSI are doing during the 'use and learn' period

2. Engaging with pharmacies








1. Test visits of pharmacies

- Looking at 3 types of supporting evidence:
 - Observing practices and the premises
 - Having conversations with those in governance roles and their teams
 - Looking at relevant documentation
- Not assessing individual performance
- Begin monitoring assessments early 2021.

More focus on what we see and what staff tell us



Moving forward

The Standards:

- do not replace the need to comply with legislation
- complement legislation and guidance that support pharmacies
- will be taken into account when PSI staff are carrying out inspections and quality assurance visits.

low were the Operational Standards developed?

The Standards were developed through the formation of a safety collaborative with practicing pharmacists, the Iridi. Pharmacy Linius (IPU), the Intail's Service Executive (IRSI) and the Intail's Protection Survivalence Centric (IPISC), The Standards reflect the national public health advice in place to manage the COVID-19 outbreak and are informed by approaches adopted internationally.

How will the Standards be implemented?

As the Standards are an evolution in how the PSI regulates the pharmacy sector, a learning and engagement approach to implementation will be adopted through an initial time and learn in period. This flexible period will allow pharmacy owners, superintendent and supervising pharmacists to have time to reflect upon their practice and adapt, your practices where needed. 
